# Changes for 2017

## Programs

- Plan to expand Student Bid program to include time for networking with students and giving students two presentations – “What Your Future Employer is Looking For In A New Engineer”, and “Regional Outlook for Projects and Employment”
- Full day program on Safety Excellence
- If sufficient interest, a second project tour in the summer

## Membership

- Membership levels will allow you attendees per year, rather than per program – thus giving members more flexibility to send more people to specific programs of their interest
- Consideration of pilot project with University of Washington’s Center for Education and Research in Construction (CERC) to research specific construction problem as requested by members

## What Does Membership Cost and What Does It Include?

- **Level 1: \$1750/year** — includes 8 program attendances per year plus company name on NWCCC website
- **Level 2: \$2750/year** — includes 16 program attendances per year plus company name and logo on NWCCC website, other opportunities for involvement
- **Level 3: \$5000/year** — unlimited program attendance, speaking opportunities, monthly program sponsorships, company name and logo prominent on NWCCC website
- Non-members can attend the monthly programs for \$299 per person. Member attendance beyond annual allotment are \$299 per person.
- Annual Conference fees TBD (\$99 per person in 2016)
