




HOW DOES SOMEONE SURVIVE THIS?




BEGAN IN FLORIDA IN 1948:

- ORIGINALLY STREET VEHICLES THAT OWNERS/DRIVERS MODIFIED FOR RACING
- ROOTS IN BOOTLEGGERS DURING PROHIBITION THAT WOULD OUTRUN THE POLICE WITH THEIR SOUPED-UP CARS
- CONSISTS OF FOUR NATIONAL LEVELS, AS WELL AS REGIONAL US, INTERNATIONAL, AND EVEN ON-LINE RACING

- 1964: WINDOW NET
 - FLYING DEBRIS AND KEEP ARMS/SHOULDERS IN THE CAR
- 1965: FUEL CELLS
 - PREVENT FUEL SPILLS AND FIRES IN ACCIDENTS
- 1988 RESTRICTOR PLATES
 - RESTRICT TOP POSSIBLE SPEED OF CARS TO REDUCE FORCES AND DAMAGE IN A CRASH
- 1993 ROOF FLAPS
 - KILL SPEED, REDUCE LIKELIHOOD OF GOING AIRBORNE









- 2001: HANS DEVICES
 - HEAD AND NECK SUPPORT
- 2002: SAFER BARRIERS
 - "STILL AND FOAM ENERGY REDUCTION" ON CONCRETE RACETRACK WALLS
- 2000's: SEAT, HELMET, AND RESTRAINT IMPROVEMENTS
 - PROTECTING DRIVER FROM IMPACTS
- 2008 COMPLETELY RIGID DRIVER CAGES
 - PREVENT COCKPIT INTRUSION









SOMETIMES YOU BECOME A SAFETY CHAMPION BECAUSE IT HAPPENED TO YOU....

RYAN NEWMAN BECAME A VOCAL — OBVIOUSLY — PROPONENT OF THE INSTALLATION OF A NEW MANDATORY BAR ACROSS THE FRONT OF THE ROLL CAGE FOLLOWING THE 2009 AND 2013 CRASHES WHERE HE NEARLY SUFFERED TRAUMATIC INJURY FROM THE UPPER FRONT OF THE ROLL CAGE COLLAPSING INWARD.

What became known as the "Newman Bar" was installed in all cars in mid-2013.

IT JOINED TWO OTHER NAMED COMPONENTS OF THE ROLL CAGE: THE "PETTY BAR" (1970 WRECK) AND THE "EARNHARDT BAR" (1996 WRECK).
